If you have visited the club's old website over the last few months you will have been thoroughly frustrated to find that it had not been updated for some time. Fret no more as all that has now changed with the launch of a brand new website, which can be reached at the same domain name www.olsrugby.com. The new site uses the RFU template, which means that all league and cup fixtures and results are automatically uploaded to it. Match reports can be instantly accessed from the home page and it also has links to the club's Twitter and Facebook pages; and, once you have registered, you can pay your club subscription or enrol in the 1200 Club through it. Its development is still in the early stages and further refinements will continue to be made. So please be patient! Chairman Spriggs has driven the project through, with the very able support of Kevin Mortimer and Matthew Pritchard.

The previous website and its predecessor were developed and managed by **Ray Todd** over a number of years; and also during that time, Ray took literally thousands of photographs of club matches and events. Thanks, Ray, for your major contribution to club affairs over that time.

#### All change at the top

There are a number of new faces in key roles at the club for season 2016/17 – not new in the strict sense of the word as most are well known to members, but taking up new jobs in the club. First, our new Chairman, **Andrew Spriggs** (pictured) is known to almost everyone as he has been a member since 1972 and must be close to holding the club record for playing



longevity as you are still likely to see him turning out for the 3rd team even now. A combative second row forward, Sprigga is already tackling his new job with the same gusto and enthusiasm that has typified his playing style

over the last (almost!) 45 years. Andrew succeeds Dan Volkman, who certainly made his mark as Chairman over the last two years. If you haven't received Andrew's pre-season letter directly you can read it on the new website (*see article opposite*). Continuing as Hon. Secretary is **Alan Willis**, who must also be close to a record tenure for this job. Taking on the key role of Treasurer is **Matthew Pritchard**, who joined the club via the Mini & Junior section and who, with his wife Sue and Dan Volkman, has been one of the key influences behind the tremendous growth and success of the M & Js over the last 8 years.

On the playing side, **Stuart Birch** has stepped down from the role of Head Coach. Stuart has been outstanding as player, 1st team captain and, for almost all of the last 15 years, as Coach. We are delighted that Stuart will continue to support and mentor our new coaching team and will still be very much on the scene. Stepping into Stuart's size twelves is another former player of some distinction, **Iain Wallis**. Iain is joined in the coaching team by **David Longrigg**, another with a long pedigree in both playing and administration at the club; and a welcome newcomer, **Andy Milner**, who brings impeccable credentials with him as an RFU Community Rugby Coach in the East Midlands.

#### The season so far

A reasonable start to season 2016/17 with 14 games played by the club as a whole up to 14<sup>th</sup> October, of which 10 have been won.

Now playing in Midlands 2 East (South) the 1<sup>st</sup> XV have won 3 out of 4 league matches so far and sit in 4<sup>th</sup> place in the table, on the same points as the third placed club but with an inferior points difference. This season sees us pitched against a number of clubs we haven't met before, or haven't met for many years and our opening 4 league games were against new opponents in each case. An away win at Olney (20-12) was followed by an impressive home victory over Oundle (33-18). An injury hit side then came unstuck at Peterborough, where a well organised home side had the better of us in a 31-8 reversal; but we got back to winning ways when Rushden & Higham visited Fenley Field and, won 29-22, scoring five tries and earning a try bonus point. Subsequently the team won their 2<sup>nd</sup> round Intermediate Cup game against Kidderminster, running out handsome 59-24 winners to go into the 3<sup>rd</sup> round draw.

The real stars of the season so far have been the 2<sup>nd</sup> XV who had a 100% record after five games but then went down narrowly to Earlsdon (10-14) when the 1<sup>st</sup> XV called on almost half of their regular side. They are second in Warwickshire League 1 and have amassed over 250 points so far. A balanced blend of experience and youth, impressively led by flanker Nick Martin, their progress has been subject to regular calls made on their squad by the 1st XV. Some years after he last appeared in a 1<sup>st</sup> XV jersey, hooker Gary 'Gusher' Hammond looks as mean and as lean as in his heyday and leads the 2nds try scoring table with five tries from his four games, closely followed by another vet in Ben Shepherd with four touchdowns. When they are absent, as in the team's recent 57-5 win at Learnington, the young guns take over, this time Chris Halcrow notching 22 points with two tries and six conversions.

#### All change at the top (cont'd)

Taking on the captaincy of the 1<sup>st</sup> XV this season is **Ben Wiles**, a talented centre three-quarter, whilst **Nick Martin** continues as 2<sup>nd</sup> XV skipper. The 3<sup>rd</sup> XV have joint captains, **Barry Hipwell** and **Adi Marsh** who are together tackling the sometimes troublesome task of getting a 3<sup>rd</sup> team out. They will join forces with the Vets from time to ensure that a team takes to the field

The **3**<sup>rd</sup> **XV** have had just two outings at time of writing, wining one and losing one. A pleasing aspect of their early season has been the arrival of new players enticed in by the RFU's Return to Rugby initiative, which the club is promoting; and, encouragingly, a couple of them have come from the ranks of mini and junior players' parents. But, as ever, it often remains a struggle for joint skippers Barry Hipwell and Adie Marsh to raise a full 15 on match days, so any former players (or novices who fancy dipping a toe into the water) will always be welcome.

#### **Club Development**

#### Minis, Juniors and Colts

Just 8 years after it was first launched, with 20 youngsters there on its first day, the Club's Mini and Junior section has grown to become one of the biggest and best in Warwickshire, now numbering over 400 boys and girls under the chairmanship of **Ian McPherson**. As the club has grown and developed, so they have gone up through the age groups and the senior team is now the Under 15 squad, of whom much is expected. As Under 14s last season they were virtually unbeatable, with a squad big enough to turn out 2 full teams. The trick now is to take as many of them as possible through to senior rugby and to that end the club is attempting to put together both Under 16 and Colts teams for this season. Leading that initiative are Dan Volkman, Russ Parkinson and Andre Nutter whose principal task is to manage the transition of junior players through to the senior teams.

Both sections of the club, Senior and M & J, are agreed that to realise the club's ambitions both need to move forward with a 'one club' attitude and the necessary changes to ensure that this goal is achieved will be implemented as necessary.
